(2) THE WORK OF THE SCHOOL DURING THE YEAR.

(a) Investigation of Irish Dialects:

Brian O Cuiv's work on "The Irish of West Muskerry" was published in April, 1944.

Tomás de Bhaldraithe's phonetic study, "The Irish of Cois Fhairrge, Co. Galway", was completed, and was published in February, 1945.

The printing of Risteard B. Breatnach's work on the Irish of Ring, Co Waterford, was begun.

(b) Editions of Irish Texts from MSS.

Richard I. Best's work on the "Book of Leinster" was continued.

Michael A. O'Brien continued his work on "Corpus Genealogiarum Hiberniae", the text of which was in print at the end of the period under review.

Brian Ó Cuiv completed his preparation of an edition of "Cath Muighe Tuireadh". (The work has since been published).

Sean Mac Airt continued his work on the "Annals of Inisfallen". (Part of the text of this work has since been sent to the printers).

James Carney's edition of "Poems on the Butlers" was published in March, 1945, by which time he had already commenced work on a tract by D. Mac Fir Bhisigh entitled "De Scriptoribus Hibernicis".

Miss Sheila Falconer continued her preparation of an edition of the Irish translation of the "Quest of the Holy Grail". Miss Maire Mhac an tSaoi's edition of two Arthurian Tales, "Eachtra Mhelora" and "Céilidhe Iosgaide Léithe" was well advanced.

A. Martin Freeman's edition of the "Annals of Connacht" was completed. This work was published in June, 1944.

Rev. Lambert McKenna, S.J., completed his edition of "Bardic Syntactical Tracts", which was published in June, 1944.

Rev. Canice Mooney, O.F.M., completed his edition of "Smacinte Beatha Chriost" which was published in July, 1944. He then commenced work on two texts from MSS. in the Franciscan Library, Dublin, - "Manutiana" and "Topographical Fragments".

Séamus Ó Hinnse's work, "Miscellaneous Annals", was well advanced. The first proofs had been corrected by the end of the year under review.

(c) Early Irish History:

T. F. O'Rahilly continued his work on "Early Irish History and Mythology" in such spare time as he had at his disposal.

(d) Irish Place-Names:

Liam Price worked on the Place-Names of County Wicklow. (The first part of his work, dealing with the place-names of the Barony of Ballinacor North, has since been published).

(e) Welsh Literature:

(f) Dictionary of Classical Irish:

Preparation was begun of the first number of "Celtica", a periodical publication (edited by T. F. O'Rahilly) in which it is proposed to bring together in one volume articles (texts, topographical notes, linguistic notes, etc.) not sufficiently long to be published separately in book-form.

(2) SEMINAR.

In the seminar the following subject-matters were reported on and discussed:-

In 1943 Einstein and Bargmann had put forward an entirely new possibility of "connection" in space-time, the "distant affine connection", with the hope that it might solve the difficulties encountered in framing a "unified field theory".

Dr. Schroedinger reported on these ideas and on some work of himself and of F. I. Mautner, Scholar, intended to clarify Einstein's and Bargmann's original conception and to use it as a basis

for a wide-range generalisation of the General Theory of Relativity.

Dr. Heitler gave a course of lectures on

Nuclear Physics. These were held in the same

style as the lectures given in the previous year

on Cosmic Rays and were intended to give an up-todate survey of our knowledge of the atomic nucleus
both from the experimental and theoretical point
of view.

(3) STATUTORY PUBLIC LECTURES.

The statutory public lectures were delivered at Trinity College, Dublin, by Dr. T. E. Nevin on 12th March, 1945, and by Dr. Erwin Schroedinger on 19th March, 1945. The title of the lectures was "Light Signals from the Atom and How to Read Them".

(4) GENERAL LINES OF RESEARCH WORK.

The work (by Dr. Heitler and his pupils) on the theory of Cosmic ray mesons was resumed and improved in various ways. In particular Dr. Walsh was able to give a satisfactory account of the fact that mesons are always produced in groups consisting of several particles. At the request of the Editor of "Reviews of Modern Physics" this work was prepared for publication in a special number in commemoration of Niels Bohr's sixtieth birthday.

Dr. McConnell completed his investigation on negative protons with the result that these particles which are predicted theoretically must be expected to be exceedingly rare. The fact that they have not been observed so far is completely understandable.

Research work on distant affine connection is practically covered by Section 2 of this report.

Moreover, in December, 1944, the Statutory
Public Lectures delivered by Dr. Schroedinger in 1943
in Trinity College, Dublin, were published in bookform under the title "What is Life?" by the Cambridge
University Press. The first English edition (5,000
copies) was sold out during the year covered by the
report. An American edition is afloat. A second
English edition is in preparation. So are translations
into French, German, Italian and Spanish.

The second edition of the book "Quantum Theory of Radiation" by W. Heitler (Clarendon Press, Oxford) has appeared. At the request of the same publishers the book "Elementary Wave Mechanics" by W. Heitler (previously published in hectographed form at this Institute) was prepared for publication in proper book-form. For this purpose it was revised and considerably amplified.
